History of the district

The Schenectady City School district was established in 1854, making it one of the oldest public school systems in the nation. Initially, the district was comprised of one school that housed 1,100 students. It was located on what is currently the campus of Union College. For more than 160 years, the district has offered excellent educational opportunities and extracurricular activities to its students.

Academics

Every student's path to graduation includes excellent teachers, school leaders and other caring adults at all levels of education who will help each child meet academic expectations, plan for the future and be connected to school. Our school offers a variety of programs and opportunities designed to spark individual interest and keep students engaged in learning. We work to ensure that every students has the tools, resources and opportunity to navigate a path to graduation.

PTO & Activities

Family engagement is critical to student success. Therefore, at Lincoln, we have a full-time family empowerment facilitator on staff and a Family Center, available for parents to visit and use.
